World War I, known at the time as "The Great War" officially ended when the Treaty of Versailles was signed on June 28, 1919, at the Palace of Versailles, France. However, fighting ceased seven months earlier when an armistice, or temporary cessation of hostilities, between the Allied nations and Germany went into effect on the eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month. For that reason, November 11, 1918, is generally regarded as the end of "the war to end all wars."

Veterans Day continues to be observed on November 11, regardless of what day of the week on which it falls. A celebration to honor America's veterans for their patriotism, love of country, and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good.

In November 1919, President Wilson proclaimed November 11 as the first commemoration of Armistice Day with the following words: "To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nations..."



Did you know... there are customs when flying Old Glory? American flag etiquette is taken seriously, because this emblem deserves honor and respect. Here are some guidelines for displaying the flag at your home.

When displaying your flag in the morning it should be hoisted briskly. In the evening, it should be lowered ceremoniously. And, when the flag is lowered, make sure that no part of it touches the ground, and then folded neatly

When flying your flags on multiple staffs, the flag should be at the center and at the highest point of the group. However, when flown with other national flags, all flags should be flown at the same height. International

Remember to follow the protocols when displaying Old Glory at home.

above that of another nation in time of peace. Homeowners also like to fly their state flag in conjunction with the American flag. When sharing a flagstaff, the American flag should always fly above any other.

If you chose to hang your flag in a window, place the blue union (stars) in the upper left corner as viewed from the street. When viewed from inside, the union will be in the upper-right hand corner.

There are occasions when your flag should be flown at half-staff. When displaying at halfstaff, it must be hoisted to the peak for an instant, then lowered to half position. These times are usually ordered by the President. Occasions, such as Veterans Day, carry specific guidelines. The flag is flown at half until noon, then hoisted to the peak for the remainder of the day.

If you suspend your flag over a sidewalk from a rope extending from the house to a pole at the edge of the sidewalk, the flag should be hoisted out, union (stars) first.

When you display your flag diagonally or horizontally from a pole hung on your porch or balcony, the union should be placed at the peak. Unless it is flying at half-staff. Also, never fly your for receiving or holding anything.

usage forbids the display of the flag of one nation flag upside down. This is generally regarded as a distress signal.

> Should you choose to display a flag in your home against a wall follow these rules. First, it needs to lie flat against the wall. Next, whether hung vertically or horizontally, the union must be in the uppermost and to the flag's own right corner. Which means, it is to the observer's left.

It is customary to display the flag only from sunrise to sunset on buildings and stationary flagstaffs in the open. However, you may fly the colors 24 hours a day if it is properly illuminated during the evening.

Unless you have a special flag designed for inclement weather, only fly your flag during times of fair weather. Lower your flag during rain, and snow storms.

Your flag should be carefully cleaned and mended when necessary. If your flag has become so worn that it is no longer fit for display, do not simply throw it in the trash. It must be destroyed, by burning, in a dignified manner.

Never use your flag as a decoration of any sort, such as on cushions or handkerchiefs. Your flag should not be used as part of a costume or athletic uniform. Avoid using your flag

Clubhouse and Swimming Pool—At the 9/12/24 Board meeting, a new version of the Clubhouse and Swimming Pool Rules were approved. The rules have been sent to homeowners via email, and will be placed on the portal.

Swimming Pool Heater—The heater has been turned on for the cooler months.

Pool Furniture and Deck Area — Ken Fensin has treated and removed the weeds in the pool area (thank you Ken!). At the 9/12/24 Board meeting, a contract with Complete Cleaning was approved. They will perform a deep cleaning of the covered area of the pool deck, and clean all of the pool furniture on a quarterly basis (fans, walls, chairs and tables, etc) at a cost of \$300.00 per quarter.

Pest Control Company — At the 9/12/24 Board meeting, a contract with Massey Pest Control was approved. They will spray for ants/wasps, bait for termites, and trap for pests and are scheduled to visit the clubhouse once a month. Massey was chosen, out of the three quotes, because they don't charge an extra fee when called to deal with a pest problem.

Bourbon Social Club—A successful first meeting of the newly formed Bourbon Social Club was held at the Clubhouse in early September. All Serenoa residents are invited to attend. There is no fee.
